It is a violation of Michigan law to dispose of sharps and needles at the recycling sites and is subject to fine and/or prison (MCL 324.8905(2). [324,89052]; therefore the individual disposing of sharps inappropriately may be prosecuted to the fullest.

Montcalm County is providing all residents with an alternative direction for recyclable materials that might otherwise be disposed of in a landfill. The items accepted at the recycle centers will be processed and delivered to manufacturing plants to make new products saving landfill space and preserving our environment.

How It Works:

Consider whether the item you are throwing into the trash can be recycled. On the scheduled day, bring your cleaned materials to the recycle center in your area. Locations and hours are listed in this brochure. Attendants will be at the locations to accept items. Glass must be separated from all other items due to a safety hazard.

What Can You Recycle?

Paper

This includes newspapers, office paper, magazines, corrugated cardboard boxes, etc.



Glass

This includes any type of clear household bottles or jars.

NOTE: We are unable to accept ceramics.



Please separate glass from other items!

Metal

Tin cans, aluminum and other metals, up to two feet in length, will be accepted at the recycle centers.



Plastics

Plastics, 1 - 7, will be accepted. The symbols are usually located on the bottom of the item.



Polyethylene Terephthalate (PET or PETE). Clear, transparent containers only! (Examples: many soft drink, water and mouthwash containers)



High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) (Examples: milk jugs, soap, liquid detergent bottle, butter containers and grocery bags)



Vinyl (V or Polyvinyl Chloride PVC) (Examples: cooking oil bottles, clear food packaging)



Low Density Polyethylene (LDPE) (Examples: squeezable bottles (honey or mustard), any type of bag ranging from clean bread wrappers to mattress bags)



Polypropylene (PP), also often colored. (Examples: yogurt containers, shampoo bottles, straws, margarine tubs)



Polystyrene (PS) Rigid products only.



Miscellaneous Plastics, all other types of plastics or packaging made from more than one type of plastic.

Styrofoam will NOT be accepted.

NOTE: Labels **DO NOT** need to be removed from tin cans, plastic or glass bottles.

~ All containers must be clean ~

Household Batteries

All types of household batteries will be accepted - for example: alkaline, nickel cadmium, cell phone and button batteries.



Household batteries can be comprised of heavy metals and other elements, including nickel, cadmium, mercury, lithium, silver and zinc.

NO lead acid automotive batteries.

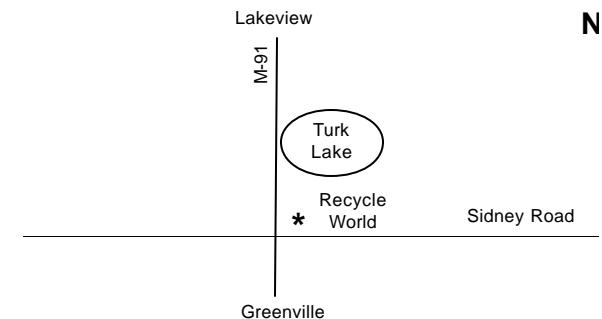


Locations and Dates
